The Course

Fine Art is a form of communication and a means of expressing ideas and feelings. In this course you will develop your drawing, painting and digital media skills through a series of challenging and thought provoking projects to expand your visual language.

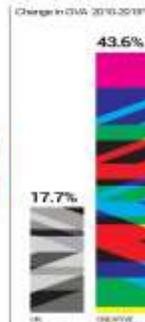
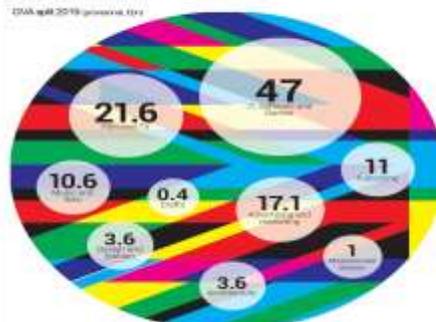
How is the Course Assessed?

The Fine Art ‘A’ level course has two units of work that are assessed in year 13. Year 12 will be a foundation year made up of a series of projects following themes set by the tutor. These projects are structured to widen your understanding of the different disciplines of Fine Art at the same time as broadening your knowledge of Artists and their work. The Year 13 course consists of one internally set skills based unit focused on a personal investigation and one externally set examination unit. The examination unit cements your learning and assesses your understanding through the creation of a smaller portfolio of work under a title set by the exam board
