The name and location of the city visited


Examples of at least two landmarks: name, brief description and history

- The name and origin of the recipe
- Ingredients and preparation steps, using your own words as much as possible
- Your own opinion of the dish or dessert: Is it healthy/unhealthy? Is it tasty? How does it reflect the cuisine of the country? Would you make it again?



Film or series review

Access Netflix (some suggestions below) or another streaming service and choose a film or series from the Spanish-speaking world. Then, create a review in Spanish up to 200 words including:

- The characters
- The summarised plot
- Your opinion on the film or series





Art gallery

Research famous artists from the Spanish speaking world (see some suggestions below). You may want to access websites from museums to see some examples (e.g.: Museo Reina Sofía) Then, create a collage of up to 10 paintings from Spanish speaking artists. Include:

- A caption from each painting with the name, artist and country
- Your opinion on your favourite paintings and why
- A reflection on how they might represent the history or culture of the Hispanic world







Musical moment

Research famous songs and singers from the Spanish speaking world (see some suggestions below). You may want to use youtube as a starting point. Then, select at least two singers. Listen to their songs — maybe even try karaoke or filling in the lyrics at lyricstraining.com. Create a short poster in Spanish including:

- A brief biography of the singer
- The names of the songs heard and their subject (e.g.: love, friendship, etc.)
- Your opinion of them
- A short reflection on how they are similar or different from singers in English or other languages and how they represent the culture in Hispanic world







News diary

Access news channels on youtube or news webpages from the Spanish speaking world (see some suggestions below). For at least about a week, select at least one news title and maybe even try to read a whole article or video. Create a diary in Spanish where you record the following every day:

- The news title
- The translation of the title
- A brief summary of the main points of the article or video
- A short reflection on the current affairs in the Hispanic world, compared to your life here in the U.K.: are we facing the same issues? are there any similarities between both countries? what is your reaction to these news?









Verb challenge

<u>Choose 5 to 10 high frequency verbs in Spanish.</u> Create a <u>little booklet</u> for yourself with a <u>verb table</u> for <u>each verb</u>, with <u>conjugations in the present, preterite, imperfect, future, conditional</u>. Once you are comfortable with all the conjugations, <u>quiz yourself</u> on <u>up to 25 verb forms</u>. E.g.: I go = (Yo) voy. Keep creating quizzes until you reach a good score! Alternatively, you may use the website conjuguemos.com to test yourself online. See below some suggestions of high frequency verbs.
